### ● [School Web Site Evaluation Rubric](#)

This rubric has been developed by North Star School District in Alaska (USA) to help school Webmasters to evaluate pages/sites before they are made public. While the rubric is meant to be applied to school Web sites generally, it is also appropriate for school library Web sites.

### ● [Web Design for Instruction -- Web Questionnaire Results](#)

This site was created by Bonnie Skaalid in 1999 to report the results of a Web-based questionnaire survey dealing with instructional Web sites. The results are presented with the idea that other educators might learn from the survey and avoid some of the problems encountered by respondents.

### ● [School Website Management](#)

School Website Management is a listserv for Webmasters in elementary and secondary schools. "The group addresses issues specific to k-12 website development and management through shared experiences, resources, concerns, questions, and supportive critiques from school webmasters." Messages posted to the listserv can also be read on the eGroups Web site, and it is possible to join (subscribe to) the listserv through the Web site.
